THE REV. DR. MARK OLDENBURG Guest Preacher and Speaker Anniversary Sunday, September 22nd

This year, on the occasion of the 291st anniversary of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church, our guest preacher and lecturer will be the Rev. Dr. Mark Oldenburg. The Steck-Miller Professor Emeritus of the Art of Worship at United Lutheran Seminary, he is a graduate of Gettysburg College, the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia. and Drew University. For over thirty years, he taught worship and served as chaplain and dean of the chapel at then Gettysburg Seminary. Along with hymns and sermons, Dr. Oldenburg has published articles on the church year and the history of worship among American Lutherans. He also coauthored several books, including The Historical Dictionary of Lutheranism. In retirement, he continues to serve as the chair of Music, Gettysburg!, a free concert series hosted by United Lutheran Seminary. Before teaching at the seminary, he served congregations in New Jersey, where he also worked part-time on the synod staff as the coordinator of Evangelical Outreach.

AN AMERICAN FAMILY: KRAUTHS AND SPAETHS Parlor at 9:00 a.m.

Dr. Oldenburg will present a lecture about four generations of theologians, hymn-writers, musicians, and a recently discovered family scandal. They helped to establish two seminaries, several hymnals, and the city of Cape May Point, NJ. They served as heads of colleges and edited weekly papers, brought deaconesses to Philadelphia, translated some hymns that we still sing, changed the shape of music in America, and (apparently) one of them rather dramatically lost the love of his wife. If you like history, theology, or gossip, this is your hour!



It's that time of year again! As we begin to head into Fall, the season of music ministry is returning to Christ Lutheran. As always, there are plenty of ways that you can participate.

- 1.The adult choir sings at each service. In addition to leading the hymns, the choir also presents an offertory anthem each week. Rehearsals are held at 9am each Sunday before worship. Rehearsals will resume for adult choir on September 15.
- 2. If a weekly commitment might be too difficult to fit into your schedule but you would still enjoy singing, perhaps you would be interested in a new offering. This year, we will offer a "Festchor" or Holiday Choir. During Advent and Lent, you can join the choir to participate in the singing for Christmas and Holy Week. We perform a good number of anthems and choral works during these times to elevate the sacredness of these events in the liturgical year and would love to have greater numbers for them! If interested in this, please reach out to me. Further announcements about when rehearsals begin will be sent out.
- 3. If singing is not your thing, perhaps you would be interested in ringing instead! The bell choir rehearses each week and plays at worship about once every four to five weeks. Rehearsals take place in the choir loft from 11:40am-12:10pm on Sundays.
- 4. If you have a child or young teen interested in the music ministry, they can join the children's choir and ensemble that meets directly after Sunday school and participates several times in worship during the year.

In the case for all of these ensembles, reading music is NOT required. Your colleagues and director are always there to help. There are lots of ways to participate in the music ministry here, and I invite you to send any questions about it to me at music@christlutheranyork.com.
