

Interim Pastor newsletter November 2024

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

First of all I want to tell you how excited I am about serving as your interim Pastor! As I write I have only been serving for one week but already I have experienced a warm welcome from the staff and Council leaders. They couldn't have been more gracious. I plan to write a letter for the newsletter every month but this one will be a little longer as I have some items that I want you to know right away.

- I will be in the office Monday through Thursday morning unless I have a meeting elsewhere. Friday will be my day off.
- I want you to know that you can call me whenever you need me. My cell number is 515-321-4582. You can also reach me at the church phone number during office hours.
- PLEASE be sure to let me know if you or a family member is hospitalized. Mindreading is not a skill I have mastered.
- The Council is planning a Sunday in the next couple of weeks when my wife Stephanie can be available for a special coffee hour during which I will pull up a chair and conduct an open forum. I have found this to be a great way for you to get to know your new interim pastor.

One thing I have appreciated is the number of people who have said "If there is anything that I can do for you please just let me know". Well, if you are one of those people, I'm taking you up on it. One thing that concerns me is the number of shut-ins we have in their own homes or assisted living facilities. I have always tried to bring communion to shut-ins once a month. I cannot do that by myself. So what I am asking is for as many volunteer Eucharistic ministers as we can. All that this involves is taking a home communion kit (these are furnished by the church) along with you after worship on Sunday and then visiting one of our shut-ins where they live sometime during that week. I will provide a brief liturgy for home communions. You can look over our shut-in list in the office and select one that you know or you may choose to use this opportunity to develop a new friendship. The more volunteers we get, the better I can get around to each shut-in once a month.

CHURCH OFFICE/STAFF/CHILD CARE SNOW/BAD WEATHER POLICY:

Any evening services/ activities that are on the calendar when a snow/bad weather day occurs, could possibly be cancelled or delayed. Always check with the pastor/group leader/chairperson/music dept. person/property dept./church office or any other contact person before coming to the church. For Sunday services, after assessing the weather condition, Pastor Doug will determine whether the church services will be cancelled or delayed. This information will be relayed to WGAL 8 for display on the WGAL 8 website (WGAL.com) and/or possible television broadcast.
