From the Pastor's Pen

I hope that this finds all of you well and staying warm! You know, we are currently in the liturgical season of Epiphany. This season bridges the gap between Jesus' birth, celebrated during the twelve days of Christmas, and his passion, dealt with in the season of Lent.

The season of Epiphany focuses on Jesus' revelation of his true identity to the entire world. This season recalls the birth of Jesus, the coming of the Magi to adore the Christ child, the baptism of Jesus, his first miracle (sign) at the wedding feast in Cana of Galilee, and his transfiguration. This wonderful season calls us to light and truth. Remember, as we learn in John's gospel, Jesus is the light of the world and the truth.

Throughout the remainder of this season let us focus on our Lord being the light of the world. May we share the light with which he has blessed us at our baptism with all people, for our God is indeed a God for the whole world. Let us continue to do this missionary work to the glory of our Lord.

Lent then begins on February 18 this year and lasts forty days, excluding Sundays which are always festival days celebrating the resurrection.

The word Lent originally meant “spring” and is a time to reflect on baptism and its basis in the death and resurrection of our Lord. It is a time for rebirth and renewal in preparation for the celebration of Easter. Reflecting on the suffering and death of Jesus occurs most pointedly during the last week in Lent known, of course, as Holy Week.

The traditional color of Lent is purple, suggesting somberness and solemnity. During this season we focus on human sinfulness and brokenness as contrasted with God’s love and mercy for us. This is a time for engaging in such ancient practices (retained from Judaism) of fasting, praying, and charitable giving. As we reflect on our frailty and sinfulness (depicted in the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday) and on God’s amazing grace for us, we are better prepared and enabled by the Spirit to understand and appreciate Easter.

It is good having you worship with us in person and/or online. May God’s light, love, mercy, and forgiveness move you and me to faithfully worship our gracious God and eagerly serve in our Lord’s name. I look forward to worshiping together with you.

Christ Lutheran Church Members,





CHURCH OFFICE/STAFF/ CHILD CARE SNOW/BAD WEATHER POLICY:



Again, this year (winter 2025-2026), the church office, childcare center, will follow the York City Schools Cancellation/Delay Policy (Monday through Friday). If the York City Schools have a delay, cancellation or early dismissal due to snow/bad weather, then the office staff, and childcare center will do the same. On snow/bad weather days, the property department will be in contact with the snow removal contractor to do sidewalk and parking lot clearing/salt application. Any evening activities that are on the calendar when a snow/bad weather occurs, could possibly be cancelled or delayed. Always check with the pastor or contact person for the activity before coming to the church.

For Sunday services, after assessing the weather condition, the pastor and council president will determine whether the church services will be cancelled or delayed. This information will be communicated through a voice message on the office phone, an email blast, and relayed to WGAL 8 for display on the WGAL 8 website (WGAL.com) and/or possible television broadcast.
